The Story

Baron Zeta. Pontevedrian Ambassador in Paris, is host at a celebration in honour of the 93rd birthday of the ruling Duke. Zeta, middle-aged and a little pompous is confident of the virtue of his wife Valencienne. She, however, is foolishly flirtatious and naively in love with Count Camille de Rosillon, a Frenchman. Camille writes the words "I love you" on Valencienne's fan, which she then loses. This fan causes endless trouble before it is finally recovered.

The pretty young widow, Madame Anna Glavari, who is one of the guests, is much sought after by the men, chiefly on account of the twenty million francs left to her by her late husband. This money is in the Bank of Pontevedro, and if removed would mean the country's bankruptcy. In order to prevent this it is imperative that Anna should not marry a foreigner, so Zeta sends for Count Danilo Danilovitsch and asks him to exert his well-known charm in winning Anna - and her millions.

Anna and Danilo turn out to be old sweethearts who parted on bad terms and are now at daggers drawn. Danilo refuses to marry Anna "even for the Fatherland" but promises Zeta that he will eliminate other suitors. He proves to be very successful in this, but finally has to pay the penalty by admitting his love for Anna who is able to sing "So once more women score over men!"

Sandra Lewis

(Madame Glavari) joined CMP for our 1989 production of Show Boat playing Magnolia. Since then she has played the role of Rose Maybud in Ruddigore and Calamity in Calamity Jane. She has taken leading roles with many of the local societies her most recent being Phoebe in Yeoman of the Guard with the Savoy Singers and Reno in Anything Goes with the Generation Theatre.

Mark Siney

(Count Danilo) is 22 and although this is his first show with CMP he is a very busy young man. Last year he played the roles of Jack Point in Yeoman of the Guard with Reading Operatic, Tony in the Boyfriend with Woodley Light Operatic and Cable in South Pacific also with Woodley. He previously played Danilo with Pangbourne Operatic in 1990.

Ken Goode

(Baron Zeta) joined CMP twelve years ago. He has been a principal in every show since then including Despard in Ruddigore, Capt Andy in Show Boat and Francis Fryer in Calamity Jane.

Eileen Goode

(Valencienne) joined CMP in 1976 and has been active in the Society ever since, playing principal parts in CMP productions including Maria in Sound of Music, Kate in Kiss Me Kate and Ellie in Show Boat. She was Chairman of the Society from 1983-89 and has produced many small shows and carol concerts. She returns to the boards this year after successfully producing Calamity Jane for us in 1991.

Philip Fryer

(Camille) started singing whilst at University. Since then he has toured in Europe with the Taverners choir and the London Baroque Soloists. He sang the role of one of the Dwarfs in Miles Foreman's film Amadeus and performed in the Mozart Bicentennial Concert at the Carnegie Hall. He has also played Joseph in the Dreamcoat. This is his first performance with CMP.

Roger Lansdown

(St.Brioche) joined CMP last year as Danny Gilmartin in Calamity Jane. He has since performed with Woodley Light Operatic in South Pacific and The Boy Friend.

Charles Parker

(Cascada) This is his first principal role having joined CMP for Calamity Jane last year. He sang with Woodley Light Operatic Society in The Boyfriend in January this year.

David Rust

(Njegus) was for some years a professional actor. He has been involved with Amateur Operatic societies in the area since the early 50's. He has played many leading roles with Reading Operatic and Woodley Light Operatic including Col Pickering in *My Fair Lady*, Koko in the *Mikado*, Earl of Mountararat in *Iolanthe*. He is also an area representative for NODA. This is his first performance with CMP.

Angela Steele

(Olga) is performing with CMP for the first time. She has however had several principal parts with Woodley Light Operatic including Tzeitel in *Fiddler on the Roof*, Mrs Paroo in *The Music Man*, Leila in *Iolanthe* and Dolly in *Annie Get Your Gun*.

Claire Lawson

(Praskovia) joined CMP last year for Calamity Jane. This is her first principal role, her previous experience having been at school and university.

Alison Davis

(Sylvia) has joined CMP this year for her first production. Her previous singing experience has been with choirs and choral societies.

Tony Kershaw

(Kromov) is in his third year with CMP. He was in the Chorus for Ruddigore and played Rattlesnake in Calamity Jane last year.

Robin Macdonald

(Bogdanovitch) is in his third year with CMP. He has also sung in the Chorus in Woodley Light Operatic productions of *Iolanthe* and *South Pacific*.

Paul Tysoe

(Pritsch) has just joined CMP.

Maggie Uttley

(Producer) is in charge of a CMP production for the first time. She has produced over 74 shows for Amateur companies including operas, operettas, musicals and plays of all kinds. She trained at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and has been involved since in productions as far a field as Scotland and Kent. Since moving to the area in 1979 she has produced shows for Marlow, Maidenhead, Abingdon, High Wycombe and Woodley Operatic Societies. Her other interest is the English Folk Dance and Song Society and she has produced Folk Shows both at the Albert Hall and the Dominion Theatre in London.

Nick Austin

(Musical Director) graduated from the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, where he studied between 1976-79 under Carola Grindea and Harold Dexter. He spent a year at King Alfred's College, Winchester where he qualified as a teacher. After three years teaching as a music assistant at Garth Hill School, Bracknell, he is presently in his ninth year as Head of Music at St. Crispin's School, Wokingham. He has taught the piano in the Bracknell area for eleven years. is an organist at a local church and is also rehearsal pianist for the Bracknell Choral Society. This is his third show as Musical Director with CMP.
