

The Story

Kipps is a shop apprentice, a lad with high hopes, lots of friends and no money. He meets up with Ann, a childhood sweetheart. The romance blossoms and Kipps gives Ann half a sixpence as a token of their love. Ann agrees to marry Kipps and everything is rosy......

However, Kipps's attention is captured by the lovely (and definitely upper class) Helen Walsingham who teaches at the local evening class for which he has been volunteered. He decides that she is "too far above me" to pay attention to him. If only he had money.......

By chance, Kipps learns that he has inherited a fortune and this sudden wealth catapults him into the "upper class". Now he can have it all - money, smart clothes, rich friends, Helen and happiness! Or can he.....?

Profiles

Mark Siney (Kipps)

Mark makes a welcome return to the society for his second leading role. Many of you will remember him as Danilo in *The Merry Widow*, and we are delighted to see him back. Mark has also appeared with Reading Operatic at The Hexagon and has enjoyed many leading roles, including Joseph in *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat* - and another character created by Tommy Steele on the London stage, *Hans Anderson*.

Susan Prior (Ann Pornick)

Sue is a newcomer to CMP, although she is certainly not new to the stage. Her previous principal roles include Mabel in *Pirates of Penzance*, Dulcie in *The Boyfriend* and Polly in *The Beggars Opera* When not performing on stage she can be seen "performing" in court - she is currently training to be a solicitor.

Mark Conolly (Chitterlow)

Mark says that prior to joining CMP last year his only claim to fame on the stage was when he played the third shepherd on the left in his infant school nativity play, but then there's always room for late developers in CMP, especially when they have Mark's talents. This is his second principal role, last year he played Ali Hakim in *Oklahomal*

Liz Darkin (Helen Walsingham)

Liz is in her second year with CMP. Last year she could be seen as a poor farmer's daughter in *Oklahoma!* but has found her true vocation by playing a "terribly posh person" this time round. Although this is her first principal role with CMP, she has played principal parts in *The Mikado, Oliver* and *The Wizard of Oz*.

Jean Young (Mrs Walsingham)

This is Jean's eighth show with CMP, which has become more a way of life than a hobby. She has appeared in the chorus as well as principal roles with the society, notably Parthy in *Showboat* and Susan in *Calamity Jane*.

Andy Lee (Mrs Botting)

Andy says she has been with CMP for so long now she should really be drawing her pension! Instead she has cornered the market playing a variety of ladies "of a certain age" - her most recent principal role being Adelaide Adams in *Calamity Jane*.

Wendy Watson (Kate)

Wendy joined CMP for *The Merry Widow* where she was seen to dance a mean Can-Can! She was no stranger to the stage, however, having played Irene in *Jane McFudd* and Helen Walsingham in *Half a Sixpen*ce for Accrington and Blackburn Amateur Theatre. Last year many of you will remember her as Ado Annie in *Oklahoma!*

Paula Critchley (Flo Bates)

Until fairly recently Paula spent most of her time backstage being terribly technical, but has now been persuaded to venture onto the stage where she has appeared for EBOS in several productions and for CMP in *Oklahoma!* Her principal roles include Dulcie in *The Boyfriend* and Virtue in *Anything Goes*. She has not yet achieved her ultimate ambition of performing in *The Little Shop of Horrors*, but she is working on it.

Chris Pask (Emma)

Chris joined CMP this year and was rather surprised to find herself a principal! She has previously appeared in the *Pyjama Game* and *Olde Time Musical Hall* with ICL. She also had the dubious pleasure of being cast as the Chief Fairy in the Pantomime, *Babes in the Wood*.

Claire Lawson (Victoria)

Claire joined CMP for *Calamity Jane* and has appeared in most of their shows since then. Her last principal role was Praskovia in *The Merry Widow*. She has also appeared in *Boop a Doop* and *Beyond Reasonable Doubt* with Wokingham Theatre. She finds the role of shop girl very easy - in her years BC (before children) she was Personnel Manager for Sainsburys!

Tony Kershaw (Mr Shalford)

Tony joined CMP several years ago for *Ruddigore* (he was a ghost) and has appeared in all productions since. His principal roles include Rattlesnake in *Calamity Jane* and Kromov in *The Merry Widow*. He has been treasurer for CMP for the past two years and we are very pleased to have him on our side - by day he turns into a VAT man!

John Taylor (Young Walsingham)

The love of the theatre and the affliction of being the ultimate volunteer brought John from Crowthorne Amateur Theatrical Society. When he is not being volunteered for other parts, John is extremely busy with CATS. He has taken part in many pantomimes and was recently in the highly successful comedy *Noises Off*. He is currently directing the farce *Runt for your Wife*.

James Lole (Buggins)

James is a well-known member of EBOS where he was last seen playing Lord Evelyn Oakleigh in *The Boyfriend*. He also appeared in a university production of *Sweeny Todd* and when he is not at rehearsals for EBOS and CMP he performs in a travelling Olde Time Music Hall group Cabbages and Things. In August he will be travelling north with the group to appear in the Edinburgh Festival.

Tim Marshall (Sid Pornick)

Tim is a real stage addict and is a member of many societies. He has appeared in many productions - this year he made a brief appearance in Park Opera's *Hansel and Gretel* and he is currently rehearsing a principal role in *The Sorcerer*. He is also going to Edinburgh in August as part of the group Cabbages and Things.

Simon Hunt (Pearce)

We are pleased that after a three year break, Simon joined CMP this year to renew his acting career. He made his debut at university playing Ko Ko in *The Mikado*, rapidly followed by Cupid in *Orpheus in the Underworld*. He is a man of many talents as he has also been lighting director for university productions.

Roger Lansdown (Carshot)

Roger joined CMP in 1991 when he played Lt. Danny Gillmartin in *Calamity Jane*. Other principal roles include St Brioche in our production of *The Merry Widow* and Nicholas Wainwright in Shinfield Theatre's recent production of *Charlie Girl*. Roger is a member of so many societies that he rarely has time for anything else - but he's open to offers!

Maggie Uttley - Producer

Maggie has been producing amateur shows for more years than she cares to remember—she has now been involved with at least 76! She trained at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and has been involved in productions as far apart as Scotland and Kent. She moved to this area in 1979 and has produced shows for Marlow, Maidenhead, Abingdon, High Wycombe and Woodley societies. Maggie still loves the stage and delights in seeing a script "come to life" under her direction. We are very pleased that Maggie is with us for her third production with CMP.

Richard Stockton - Musical Director

After studying physics at Imperial College, Dick went on to study singing and conducting at the Guildhall School of Music. He is very well known amongst local societies, he also teaches singing in his home town of Camberley. Although this is his first show with CMP, Dick has had a busy year, he was musical director for the Savoy Singers' recent production of *Pirates of Penzance*, and he is currently working on *Trial by Jury* and performances of *Carmina Burana* and *Dream of Geronius*. When he is not wielding the baton Dick works as a freelance Business Consultant and Systems Analyst.
